2. Governor's Committee to End Homelessness (GCEH) updates

*Report given by Heather Bradley-Geary

- SOAR Committee (SSI/SSDI Outreach Access and Recovery), Missouri is one of only eleven states to have program piloted. Trainings are being scheduled throughout the state, an email will be sent out with training dates.
- Re-Entry Committee meets on a monthly basis to discuss ex-offender housing. The committee plans to have a report to the GCEH in the next two months with recommendations.
- Awareness Committee, Sandy Wilson gave report. Sandy gave an overview of Homeless Awareness Day that occurred on November 19, 2009. The committee received 317 posters for the event and 125 people were in attendance. Sandy stated that a Power Point of all the posters will be posted on the MASW website. Sandy stated that feedback is needed from agencies on the success of the events, including the need for workshops and agency booths.
- Project Homeless Connect Committee, Heather stated that the first project homeless connect occurred in Columbia on August 7, 2009 and was a success. The GCEH is going to hold a project homeless connect each calendar year in a different part of the state, the next event will occur in Branson. The committee will meet the second Tuesday of every month. The next meeting is set for January 12, 2010 at 1pm at Developmental Connections, 1533 East State Highway 76, Branson, MO. The ultimate goal of the GCEH is to host Project Homeless Connect day throughout the state of Missouri.

3. CoC updates

- Application submission, Heather reported that the CoC application was submitted to HUD on Monday, November 23rd. HUD will be reviewing renewal applications first and then focus on new projects. The review committee of the GCEH will send out letters regarding applications to agencies that applied for funding.
- Funded agency requirements, Heather reported the funded agency requirements:

1. A copy of the technical submission needs to be sent to Mandy Fangmann with the GCEH in addition to HUD.
 2. Agency must attend three of the four regional meetings, annually.
 3. A copy of the APR must be submitted to Mandy Fangmann with the GCEH in addition to HUD.
 4. Agency must participate in the bi-annual Point-in-Time Count.
 5. One technical assistance visit will occur by Mandy Fangmann one time per year.
- Annual Report to the Governor; media pieces, Heather reported that the planning committee is working on the GCEH annual report to the Governor. The GCEH is in need of media pieces that show what your agency and community has done for families and individuals who are homeless. Any media release detailing events that your agency has needs to be forwarded to Mandy Fangmann.
 - 2010 Regional Housing Team Meeting schedule, Heather handed out the schedule. Region 10 prefers to continue meeting in Sedalia.

4. Point in Time Count (PITC)

- Summer count report, Heather reviewed the report focusing on region 10 numbers. Heather stated that if the group wanted even more specific information to contact Mandy Fangmann. Heather noted to the group that one survey needs to be completed for each individual or family. The GCEH can not accept surveys with several names on one page. Please do not include DESE numbers, as DESE counts children who are doubled up as homeless. The current HUD definition of homeless does not allow doubled up as homeless, however, with the passage of the HEARTH act this will change in 2011. There was discussion regarding the strengths of the last count and the new definition of homeless.
- Winter Point-in-Time count date, Heather reported that the next count will occur on Wednesday, January 27, 2010.
- Leaders for the count
 - Unsheltered: Heather passed out sign-up sheet for county leaders.
 - Sheltered: Sandy discussed the process of the surveys, including a discussion regarding hotel and motel vouchers.

5. HMIS Updates

- HPRP, Sandy Wilson facilitated a discussion about HPRP and the input into the HMIS system. Sandy stated that if your agency signs up for training please be sure to attend, as there are only a certain number of available training spots.
- MHTF agencies with Homeless Prevention funds, Sandy reported that any agency receiving Homeless Prevention funds for the 2010 grant cycle must enter into HMIS. If you agency is selected for funding, HMIS will contact you after January 1, 2010. Your data must be entered within three days, this process will begin on April 1, 2010.

7. Agency reports/announcements

University of Central Missouri (UCM): Scott Boyce presented on classes that are available through UCM at no cost to Missouri citizens.

Missouri Housing Development Commission: Heather Bradley-Geary stated that Trust Fund recommendations will be posted on Friday, December 11th and will go before the commission on Friday, December 18th. If the commission approves recommendations, the approved list will post on Monday, December 21st. Mandy Fangmann will be on maternity leave beginning mid January and will return in April. Please contact Heather if you need anything during the time period.

Salvation Army: Cynthia Hopper stated that their Christmas requests are increasing.

Johnson County HELP: Susan Moore stated that they will be having their Christmas party on December 10, 2009. At Thanksgiving they served over 400 meals.

Pettis County: Bob Vickers reported that they are getting 25 to 30 assistance calls a day.

Catholic Charities: Velina Todd stated that their calls for assistance have been increasing.

Missouri Association for Social Welfare: Sandy Wilson reported that they are in the process of adding two positions to the HMIS staff. These positions will office out of Jefferson City; in addition no relocation costs will be paid.
