### Grants: from grants.gov -> find grant opportunities -> browse by category -> housing:

- HUD Section 202 Supportive Housing for the Elderly (11/13/09 close date):  
This program provides funding for the development and operation of supportive housing for very low-income persons 62 years of age or older. HUD provides capital advances and contracts for project rental assistance in accordance with 24 CFR part 891. Capital advances must be used for the construction or rehabilitation of a structure, or acquisition of a structure with or without rehabilitation.
- HUD Section 811 Supportive Housing for Persons with Disabilities (11/16/09 close date):  
This program provides funding for the development and operation of supportive housing for very low-income persons with disabilities who are at least 18 years old. If you receive funding through this program, you must assure that supportive services are identified and available.
