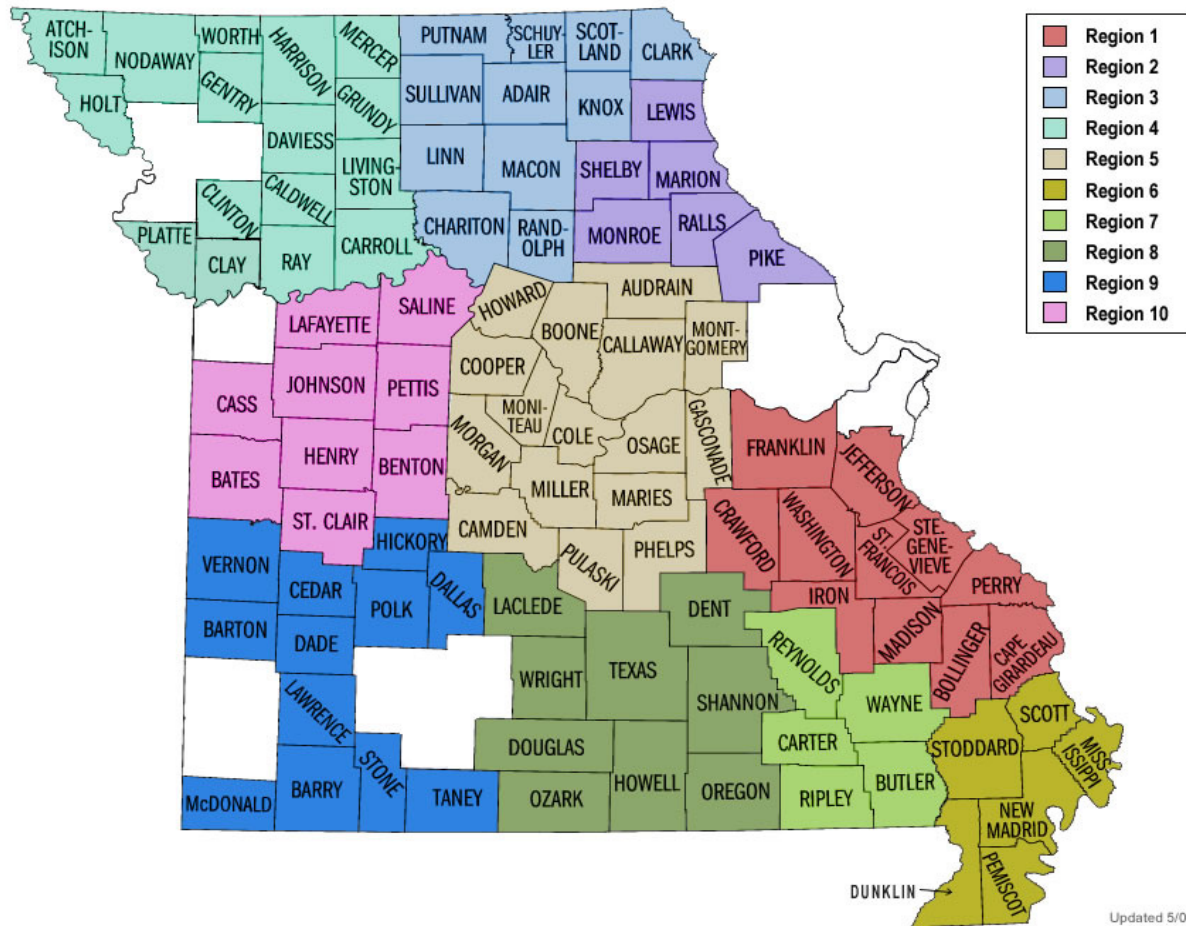

Missouri Balance of State Continuum of Care Sheltered Point-in-Time Homeless Count Statistical Report July 28, 2010

The Welfare of the People Shall Be the Supreme Law

The Missouri Association for Social Welfare (MASW) conducted the Summer Sheltered Point-In-Time Homeless Count on July 28, 2010. The following statistical reports were compiled from the data obtained from the 101 counties that comprise the Balance of State Continuum of Care (BoS CoC).

Data was collected by identified agencies, churches and community groups that provided:

- Emergency Shelter – Any facility whose primary purpose is to provide temporary shelter for individuals in general who are experiencing homelessness or for specific populations of individuals who are experiencing homelessness. The length of stay generally ranges from one night to three months.
- Transitional Housing – A housing program that is designed to provide housing and appropriate support services to individuals experiencing homelessness and to facilitate movement to independent living within 24 months.
- Hotel/Motel – placement by voucher.

Agencies that are enrolled in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) administrated by MASW for the BoS CoC had data pulled directly from the HMIS system. Other known agencies, churches, and community groups were surveyed using both an electronic survey (provided to them via email) and by direct phone calls (Survey Instrument attached).

The percentage calculations for each line item within a data category were rounded to two decimal places. This caused the total data category percentages to have a slight variance from a total 100%, adjustments were made as follow:

If the percentage total for a specific data category fell below 100%, the last reporting field in that category was adjusted up to bring the category total to 100%.

If the percentage total for a specific data category fell above 100%, the first reporting field in that category was adjusted down to bring the category total to 100%.

Data is presented here as a complete statistical report for the BoS CoC and then broken into ten separate regional level reports. The last document shows the total sheltered numbers reported from each of the 101 counties.

Definitions for demographic categories followed the guidelines set forth by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).
