

Housing Status

Complete this field at Entry and Exit from your program to indicate whether the client is homeless, at risk of becoming homeless, or stably housed.

Select *only* one value. This information is required at entry and may be an indicator of program eligibility.

1. In the ROSIE Database, open the Client Record, and click the Stats/Shelter Tab.
2. Click the appropriate **Housing Status** description.
3. Click the **Living Situation** field, and select a value which describes where the client slept the night before entering your program. This value should correspond with the Housing Status.
4. Complete the client record.

Housing Status Values

Literally homeless:

- sleeping in a place not meant for human habitation, such as cars, parks, sidewalks, abandoned buildings, or the street;
- sleeping in an emergency shelter;
- staying in a hospital or other institution, if the person was sleeping in an emergency shelter or other place not meant for human habitation (cars, parks, streets, etc.) immediately prior to entry into the hospital or institution;
- graduating from or timing out of a transitional housing program for homeless persons
- victims of domestic violence

Housed and at imminent risk of losing housing:

- being evicted from a private dwelling unit (including housing provided by family or friends)
- being discharged from a hospital or other institution
- living in housing that has been condemned by housing officials and is no longer considered meant for human habitation

And, also meet the following conditions:

- have no appropriate subsequent housing options identified, AND
- lack the financial resources and support networks needed to obtain immediate housing or remain in existing housing

Housed and at risk of losing housing:

- in their own housing or doubled up with friends or relatives and are at risk of losing their housing due to high housing costs, conflict, or other conditions negatively impacting their ability to remain housed
- lack the resources and support networks needed to maintain or obtain housing, however, such persons are not in immediate danger of becoming homeless (i.e. do not meet the criteria for being housed and at imminent risk of becoming homeless)

Stably housed are not at risk of losing housing (i.e. do not meet the criteria for being at risk of losing housing)

Don't Know indicates the client is not aware of his or her risk of losing housing.

Refused to Answer indicates the client declined to provide information related to his or her risk of losing housing.
