

2010 Student Advocacy Day

Over 250 students from eight universities across Missouri participated in MASW's Annual Student Advocacy Day for hands-on learning at the State Capitol on Tuesday, March 2.

Participants, including faculty, met in three groups (with those who had to travel farther meeting a bit later in the morning than those from colleges close to the Capitol). Meeting in the Governor Office Building, two blocks from the Capitol, students were briefed by MASW staff, and representatives of [Missourians for Alternatives to the Death Penalty \(MADP\)](#) and the [Missouri Budget Project \(MBP\)](#).

Members of MASW's Central Chapter were on hand at the briefing and in the Capitol to help students get the most out of their hands-on advocacy educational experience.
