DR. GARY L. BOWEN, Kenan Distinguished Professor, Univ. of North Carolina School of Social Work, has extensive experience working with all branches of the military services, and he has visited more than 100 military

installations worldwide in the context of consulting with military policymakers, researchers, and practitioners across a range of mental health and social service issues. Dr. Bowen is currently initiating work with the North Carolina Division of Mental Health, Development Disabilities and Substance Abuse Services to contribute to the Division's efforts to increase its outreach services and support to the civilian spouses of military members and veterans. The extension of primary and secondary prevention services and supports to this population is an important component of the Division's expanded response to the mental health service needs of veterans and their families.

DR. ANTHONY HASSAN was appointed clinical associate professor and inaugural director for the Center for Research and Innovation on Veterans and Military Families at the USC School of Social Work in 2009. Dr. Hassan is a retired Air Force officer with 25 years of experience in military social work and leadership development. He was deployed as a member of a combat stress control team during Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2004. As the center director, Dr. Hassan is responsible for the implementation of over \$10M in congressional appropriations and grants, designing evidence-based education and training curricula via innovative technologies, research related to veterans and military families and representative for all Department of Defense, Congressional, University and community relationships and partnerships.
